

GUILFORD HIGH SCHOOL BOOSTER CLUB  
Board of Directors Meeting Minutes  
June 2, 2008

President Kathy Peterson called the meeting to order at 7:20 p.m.

**Minutes of previous meeting:** Minutes were reviewed; Pam Miner made a motion to approve the May minutes, seconded by Bridget Bowers; motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Mary Kay Garganera reviewed the financial reports. This year it was a struggle to raise funds so the income was down. Fun was had making the money that was made. Concessions were down, Market Day was up, Membership was down (which has been a trend for the past five years) and attendance at events was down. Overall income was down about \$13,000 compared to last year.

Proposed appropriations were presented (see attachment). There was a discussion about where the Booster Club income comes from and how it is split evenly between academics and athletics. Brad Seago expressed his frustration of how much athletics helps in raising these funds and the percentage that actually goes back to athletics once you include both the academic appropriations and the other clubs and committees compared to the athletics appropriations. Mary Kay pointed out that the money raised by concessions was about \$33,000 and the other fundraisers combined raised about \$31,000 so the funds raised are half from the athletics and the other half by other means. Cheryl Maggio moved to approve the Treasurer's Report, seconded by Pam Shumaker. Motion passed unanimously.

**President's Report:** Kathy Peterson made her parting comments and recognized all of the chairs and committees. Highlights include:

- Buttons-Looking for a committee chair.
- Alumni-Getting off the ground, organized and well thought out.
- Concessions-We've got the best buns anywhere! The new walking tacos were a big hit.
- Carpe Diem-Needs a co-chair to be trained to take over next year.
- Farther Daughter/Mother Son Dances-Great events but need more student involvement.
- Hospitality- Well done with a lot of class.
- Major Fundraisers-Needs a chair for next year. The garage sale was successful with lower ticket items to sell. Village Green, Barnes and Noble and Moonlight Bowling all have the potential to make more money.
- Market Day-First full year under Booster Club's care. Well done with only more money making potential for the future.
- Marketing-All marketing materials were polished up and branded. Needs a co-chair. Great ground work has been laid.
- Membership and Mailings-There was a new membership brochure made and a follow up postcard was sent this year. The membership directory was changed too.
- Merchandising-New products were introduced but sales were down. The new decals were well received.
- Nominations-Critical committee.

She recognized the outgoing Board members. A fond farewell was paid to Jan Burgess, Mary Kay Garganera, Cheryl Maggio, Julia Clay, Amy Kurth, Leslie Schaye, Mel Shutt and Kathy Peterson.
